

| Seq | Absence Type   | Reason (EN)   | Description ENG   |

| 1   | Absence Type   | Medical appointment   | A medical appointment scheduled prior to the absence.   |
|     |                |   | Example: A student has a scheduled dental surgery and needs to miss school for the procedure and recovery.  |
|     |                | Short-term Illness  | Temporary illness of any kind (e.g., cold, flu, etc.).  |
| 2   |                |   | Example: A student has a mild fever and is unable to attend school for 2 days.  |
| 3   |                | Chronic illness   | For students with chronic medical conditions who may require more than 10 school days of absence, including those who require medical care outside of the UAE.  |
|     | Absent reasons |   | Example: A student diagnosed with diabetes needs to travel abroad for specialized treatment and requires extended absence from school.  |
|     |                | Medical for students<br>with Additional Learning<br>Needs (ALN) | Leave for medical or therapeutic reasons for students with additional learning needs.   |
| 4   |                |   | Example: A student with autism requires regular therapy sessions during school hours and is granted time off for this purpose.  |
| 5   |                | Family death  | Death of a first- or second-degree relative.  Example: A student's grandmother passes away, and the student is absent to attend the funeral.  |
| 6   |                | Family emergency travel   | Urgent family travel for essential reasons such as medical care, escorting a loved one, or handling a family death (outside of first- or second-degree relatives).  |
|     |                |   | Example: A student needs to travel abroad suddenly to accompany a parent who is undergoing emergency surgery.   |
| 7   |                | Study leave   | Leave of up to 4 weeks annually for board and pre-collegiate examinations, with ADEK approval. Example: A student preparing for international exams (e.g., SAT, A-levels) takes a study break, as permitted by the school and ADEK. |
| 8   |                | Examination leave   | Leave for board and pre-collegiate examinations, when approved by ADEK.  Example: A student is granted leave to sit for a board)external( exam outside of the school's examination period.  |
| 9   |                | Official community task   | Community tasks mandated by authorities, such as cleaning up beaches or other official duties (e.g., a student's required participation in an official court order or legal case).  |
|     |                |   | Example: A student is required by the court to participate in community service as part of a legal requirement.   |



| Seq | Absence Type                | Reason (EN)                 | Description ENG   |

|     |                             | Official appearance         | Mandatory appearance before an official body (e.g., a family legal case or juvenile delinquency hearing).   |
| 10  |                             |                             | Example: A student has to appear in court due to a family legal dispute and is unable to attend school on that day.                                   |
|     |                             | Extracurricular activity    | Participation in conferences, competitions, or events with the principal's approval )e.g., Model United Nations, sports events, Olympiads).           |
| 11  |                             |                             | <b>Example:</b> A student is selected to represent the school in an international debate competition and is absent for several days.                  |
|     |                             | Entertainment work          | Employment in the entertainment industry.   |
| 12  | Absent reasons              |                             | <b>Example:</b> A student who works as an actor in a television show requires time off for filming commitments.                                       |
|     |                             | Religious holiday           | Observation of religious holidays that are not classified as public holidays in the UAE.  |
| 13  |                             |                             | Example: A student observes a religious holiday not recognized as a public holiday and requires a day off from school to celebrate with their family. |
| 44  |                             | Government-approved closure | Absences due to government-sanctioned school closures, such as for extreme weather conditions.  |
| 14  |                             |                             | <b>Example:</b> The school is closed due to severe sandstorms, and all students are excused from attendance.  |
| 15  |                             | Unauthorized absence        | Absences that do not fall under the list of authorized absence reasons, as per the Student Administrative Affairs Policy.                             |
|     |                             |                             | Example: A student skips school to attend a concert without prior approval from the school.   |
|     | - Partial absence<br>reason | Authorized late             | Lateness that is excused by the school.   |
| 16  |                             |                             | <b>Example:</b> A student arrives late due to a traffic accident on the way to school, and the school marks it as an authorized late.                 |
|     |                             | Unauthorized late           | Lateness that is not excused by the school.   |
| 17  |                             |                             | <b>Example:</b> A student arrives late to school frequently without any valid reason, and the school marks it as an unauthorized late.                |
