## <u>CIRCULAR NO.69</u> GUIDELINES ON PERMITTED AND BARRED ITEMS FOR BOARD EXAMINATIONS

Dear Parents & Students of Grades 10 & 12

As you prepare to appear for the upcoming board examinations, it is crucial to approach this important milestone with discipline and responsibility. To ensure a smooth and fair examination process, the school and examination authorities have outlined specific rules and guidelines that all students must follow. These regulations are designed to maintain the integrity of the examinations and provide an environment conducive to honest efforts. Your cooperation and adherence to these instructions will provide a seamless experience for everyone.

To begin with, all students must carry their Admit Card, which serves as their entry pass to the examination centre. Regular students must also bring their School Identity Card, while private students should carry a government-issued photo identity proof. In addition, essential stationery items like pens (blue/royal blue ink), a scale, an eraser, a writing pad, and geometry tools must be packed in a transparent pouch. An analogue watch, a transparent water bottle, and necessary travel items such as a bus card are also permitted. **Any items beyond this list are strictly prohibited.** 

To prevent any form of malpractice, extensive and compulsory frisking will be conducted before entry into the examination hall. Prohibited items include textual material, calculators (except for students with disabilities), electronic devices like mobile phones, smart watches, Bluetooth devices, and other gadgets. Additionally, wallets, handbags, goggles, and any kind of eatables (except for diabetic students) are not allowed. Violation of these rules will be considered an act of unfair means and may attract severe penalties as per CBSE regulations.

It is also important to follow the prescribed dress code. Regular students must attend in their school uniform, while private students are required to wear simple, light-colored attire. Non-compliance with the dress code may result in denial of entry to the examination center.

We strongly advise you to carefully review these guidelines and ensure full compliance to avoid any inconvenience on the examination day. Remember, these measures are in place to uphold the fairness and integrity of the board examinations. Approach your preparations with confidence and focus, and make sure you arrive at the examination center well in advance to avoid unnecessary stress.
